With this objective, the feedback on curriculum along with other aspects has been a routine practice of Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC). Exclusive feedback forms have been designed for the said purpose. Recently, TMU has implemented various actions for curriculum modification in terms of CBCS implementation, OBE based formulation and emphasis on psychomotor skills. Prior to curriculum revamp, the various colleges/departments collated feedbacks from stakeholders and presented to individual BOS. Actions were then taken by the BOS based on the feedbacks. Students have also requested for courses/programmes which would enable them to get specialization in various fields, either in the form of postgraduate programmes or skills related to new avenues of employment. All the feedbacks were taken into consideration and brought in front of the Board of Study (BOS). Further action for taken in the form review and revision of content of existing syllabus, introduction of new programmes, accreditation of MOOC courses, implementation of Choice Based Credit Scheme and MOUs and collaboration with external agencies for gaining practical knowledge. Feedback was taken and collected from various teachers of the university. Along with the quantitative analysis, inputs in the form of suggestions/comments were taken into considered and analyzed as well.

Teachers have suggested that Choice Based Credit Scheme be implemented in all the programmes the University as this will help the students to choose the subjects of their interest and thereby perform better. The teachers have also asked that specialized knowledge course should be provided as well. There was an demand for teaching of new technologies in various fields. Teachers from College of Fine Arts specifically suggested that a course on Silk Screen Printing be started. Teachers from Physical Education shared the importance of Yoga and asked that Yoga for physical fitness should be taught. Teachers from College of Agriculture asked that MOOCs can be an integral part of providing education to students. All the feedbacks were taken into consideration and brought in front of the Board of Study (BOS). Further action for taken in the form review and revision of content of existing syllabus, introduction of new programmes, accreditation of MOOC courses, implementation of Choice Based Credit Scheme and special value added courses. Many other suggestions have been noted and work has been started on finding a viable solution in providing appropriate action.

Feedback was taken and collected from various alumni of the university. Along with the quantitative analysis, inputs in the form of suggestions/comments were taken into considered and analyzed as well.

Feedback received from different alumni was specific in terms of new and emerging technologies and trends. Alumni of Physiotherapy suggested that Medical Tourism is an emerging trend and knowledge should be imparted in the regular program regarding this. Many alumni expressed their interest in obtaining a degree in business and management, specifically related to imports and exports of handicrafts. Alumni of Computer Sciences suggested that Data Sciences is an upcoming field and a degree in this would help future students. Some alumni also mentioned that using Kotlin instead of JAVA would be beneficial for many Informational Technology professionals in the future. All the feedbacks were taken into consideration and brought in front of the Board of Study (BOS). Further action for taken in the form review and revision of content of existing syllabus and introduction of new programmes. Many other suggestions have been noted and work has been started on finding a viable solution in providing appropriate action.

Feedback was taken and collected from various employers of the university who have hired students from the University. Along with the quantitative analysis, inputs in the form of suggestions/comments were taken into considered and analyzed as well.

Feedback received from different employers was related to practical application of the knowledge that the students have on completion of the course. Many employers felt that students had knowledge but were not able to apply the knowledge fluently. Employers in the field of Teaching felt that the candidate were not clear with what they have learnt and so outcome of their education was not clear. A major demand was placed on the need for soft skills and communication improvement. All the feedbacks were taken into consideration and brought in front of the Board of Study (BOS). Further action for taken in the form of implementation of Outcome Based Education, developing Psychomotor Skills Development Plan and introduction of Soft Skills as Value Added Course. Many other suggestions have been noted and work has been started on finding a viable solution in providing appropriate action.

Feedback was taken and collected from various Professional Experts of Academia who visited and analyzed the syllabi of the University at various point in time. Along with the quantitative analysis, inputs in the form of suggestions/comments were taken into considered and analyzed as well.

Feedbacks from Professional experts were in the form of minor changes in the syllabi. The major suggestions were related to new and emerging trends. Experts from the field of Paramedical sciences suggested inclusion of Nanobiosensors in the programme content. Expert from Physiotherapy explained that Journal Presentation should be added for postgraduate students. Research knowledge was also mentioned as a area of attention. Expert in Computer Sciences and Information Technology recommended Cognitive Sciences to be explored and BSc in Cognitive Sciences be started. Experts from Fine Arts advised update in Advertising theory and suggested the updates should be based on changing advertising culture. All the feedbacks were taken into consideration and brought in front of the Board of Study (BOS). Further action for taken in the form of revision and updating of syllabi content. Changes in the curriculum were suggested and implemented. New programme was also introduced. Many other suggestions have been noted and work has been started on finding a viable solution in providing appropriate action.

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
