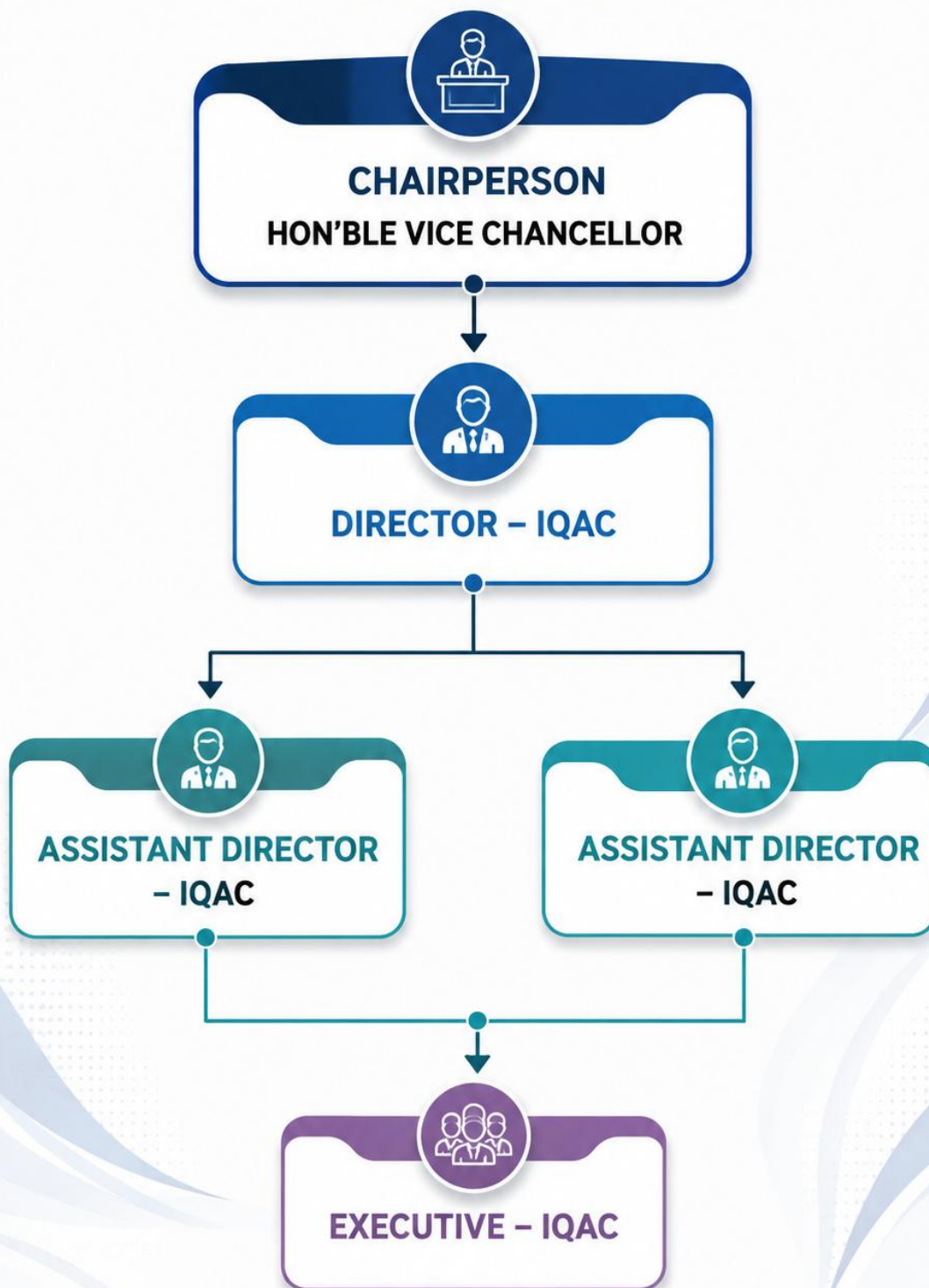

Report on the 24th IQAC Meeting, held on 23rd May, 2026



The 24th IQAC Meeting, held on 23rd May, 2026 was focused on institutional quality enhancement, accreditation preparedness, ranking submissions, faculty development, research strengthening, and administrative quality audits. The meeting emphasized the readiness for NAAC Cycle-3, NBA Accreditation (B. Pharm and MBA Programmes), ICAR Accreditation (B. Sc. Hons. Programmes), NIRF Rankings 2026, THE Rankings and QS Sustainability Rankings 2027.

Discussions: The minutes of the 23rd IQAC Meeting held on 24th February, 2026 were reviewed and unanimously confirmed by the members. The committee reviewed the Action Taken Report on decisions made during the previous IQAC meeting and approved the actions undertaken.

The Director-IQAC presented the status of NIRF Rankings 2026 data submission and query handling for registered categories. The committee reviewed the data submission status of QS Sustainability Rankings 2027. The Director-IQAC apprised members regarding preparation of NAAC Navision data for academic years 2023–24, 2024–25, and 2025–26 in view of the upcoming NAAC Cycle-3

Major Decisions

1. Faculty members were encouraged to develop discipline-specific e-content to strengthen digital learning resources.
2. The committee resolved that all colleges should organize FDPs of minimum five days (30 hours).
3. The Research & Development Cell was assigned to organize capacity-building programmes on Research Methodology and Research Proposal Writing for groups of 100–250 faculty members.
4. In view of NAAC Cycle–3 preparedness, the committee resolved to conduct biannual audits of Ancillary Departments between 15–30 June 2026. IQAC will prepare and circulate audit checklists. Departments will provide feedback and suggestions. Finalized checklist to be shared with all departments after consultation.

Conclusion

The 24th IQAC Meeting concluded with the assurance to complete all the tasks in a given time period in compliance with the institutional benchmarks. The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks delivered by The Director, IQAC.

Brief Report of Session

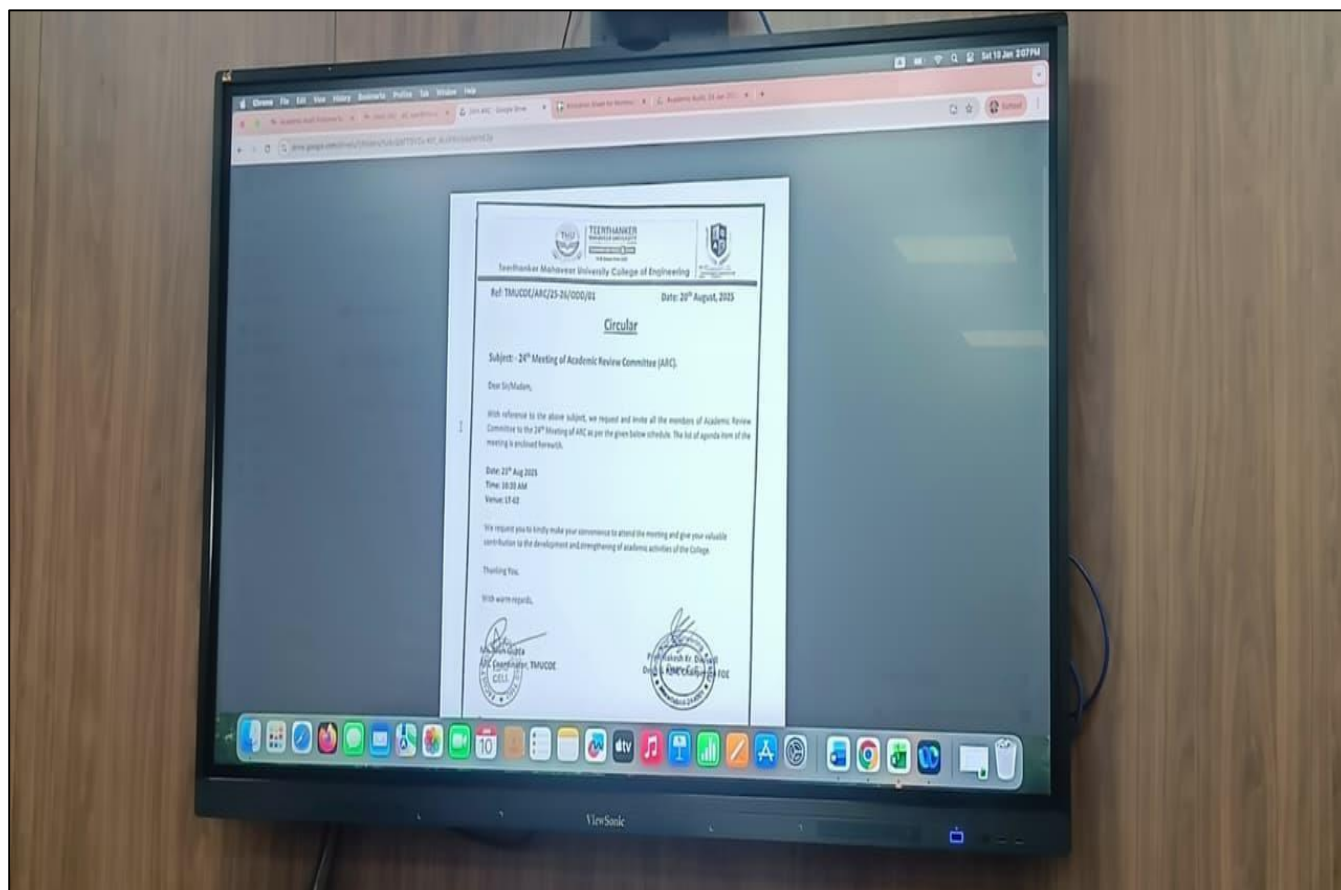

Review of Academic Audit Proforma

Internal Audit Workflow (Applicable to both Academic Units and Ancillary Departments)

The IQAC reviewed and developed a comprehensive Audit mechanism for academic and Administrative units. Academic Audits are conducted **twice every academic year**, covering both the **Odd and Even Semesters**, to evaluate academic processes, ensure compliance with institutional standards, and promote continuous improvement across all constituent and affiliated colleges and ancillary departments.

The Audit process follows a systematic and transparent workflow, ensuring accountability, consistency, and timely implementation of quality enhancement measures.

1. Release of Audit Schedule and Audit Proforma

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) prepares and circulates the Internal Audit Schedule well in advance. The relevant Audit Proforma, specific to Academic Units and Ancillary Departments, is shared to facilitate systematic preparation.

2. Submission of Audit Proforma

Each Academic Unit and Ancillary Department completes the prescribed Audit Proforma and submits the duly filled document to the assigned Internal Auditor(s), with a copy (CC) marked to the IQAC.

3. Conduct of Academic Audit

The Audit is conducted according to the approved schedule by the designated auditors. The audit encompasses a comprehensive review of academic planning, curriculum delivery, teaching-learning practices, assessment processes, student support mechanisms, research activities, documentation, and compliance with University and regulatory requirements along with other processes related to ancillary departments. The Internal Audit is conducted according to the approved schedule through document verification, physical inspection, process validation, and evidence-based evaluation.

4. Submission of Signed Audit Report

Upon completion of the audit, the audit report is finalized and duly signed by assigned auditor(s) and the respective Head of the Institution/College/ Departments, signifying the authenticity and acceptance of the observations recorded during the audit.

5. Preparation of Audit Summary Report

The IQAC undertakes a detailed analysis of all audit reports and prepares an institution-specific Audit Summary Report. The report highlights key strengths, areas requiring improvement, best practices, and recommendations for quality enhancement. IQAC share the concern weakness and deficiency in this summary report.

6. One-to-One Review Meeting

The Audit Summary Report is shared and discussed during review meeting between IQAC and the Head of the respective Academic Units and Ancillary Departments for an in-depth one-to-one review meeting at the IQAC Office. The discussion focuses on audit observations, recommendations, challenges, and strategies for continuous academic improvement.

7. Submission of Final Report for Compliance

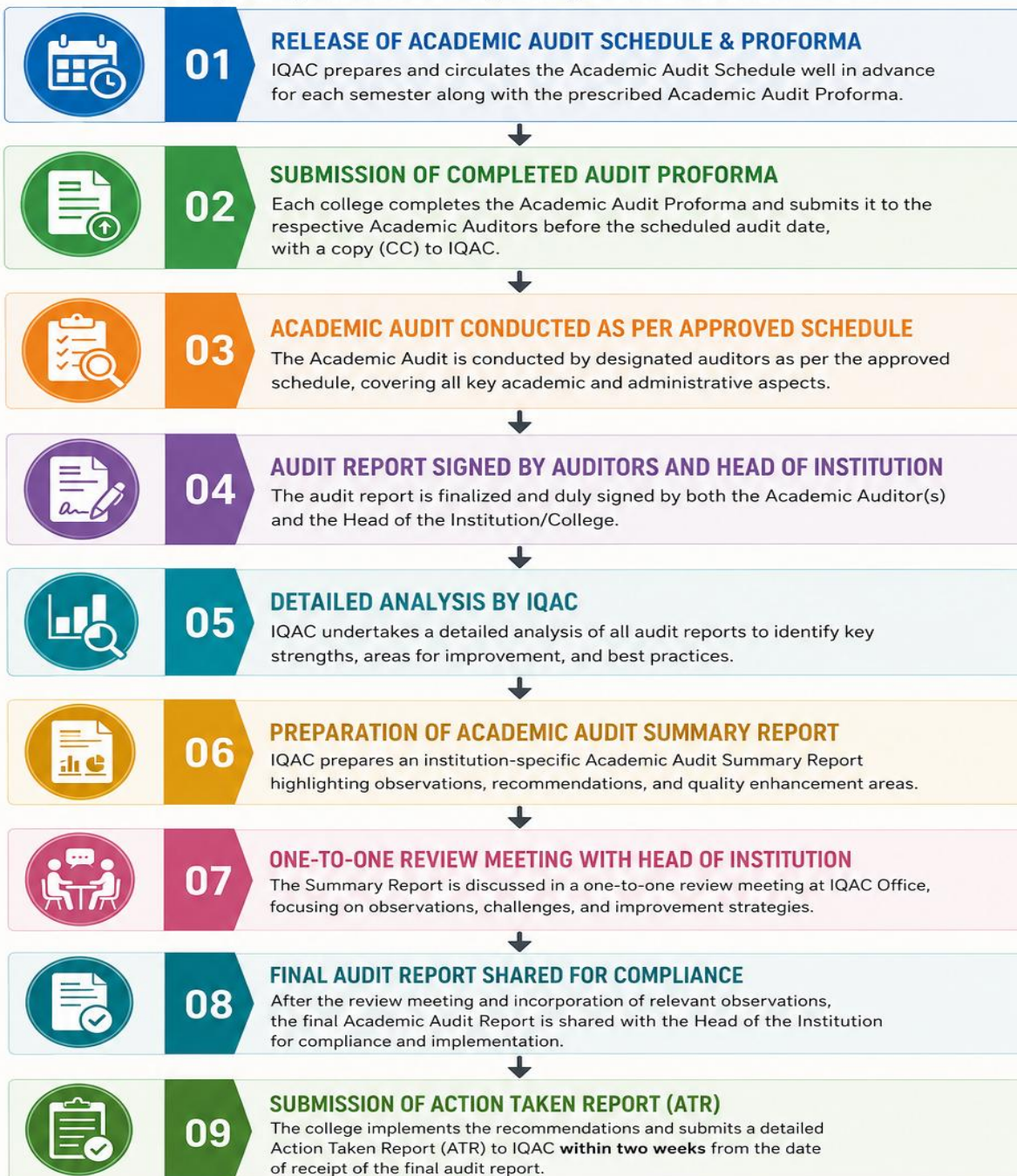
Following the review meeting and incorporation of relevant observations, the final Academic Audit Report is formally communicated for necessary compliance and implementation of the recommended actions.

8. Submission of Action Taken Report (ATR)

The respective college is expected to implement the recommendations and submit a detailed Action Taken Report (ATR) to the IQAC within two weeks from the date of receipt of the final audit report. The ATR serves as evidence of corrective measures undertaken and supports the University's commitment to continuous quality assurance.

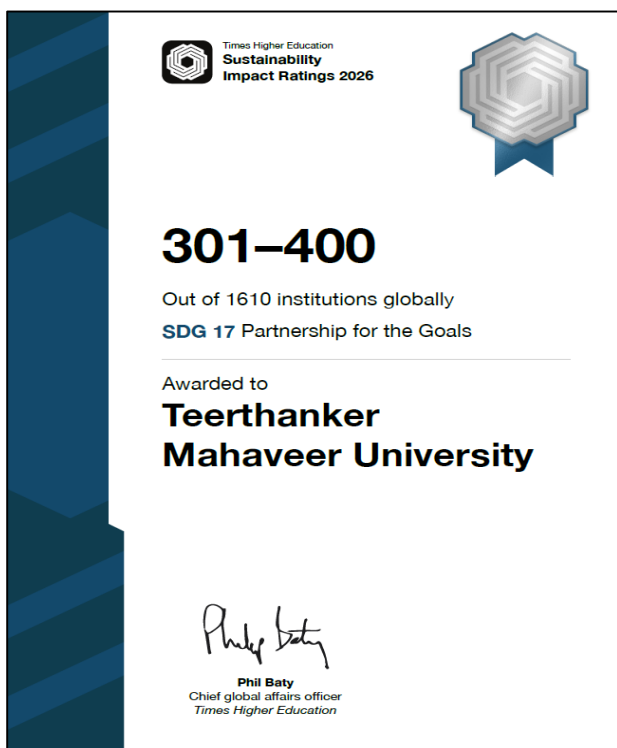

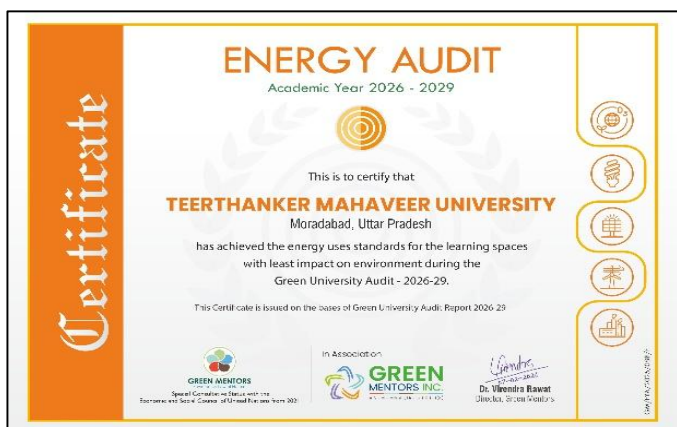

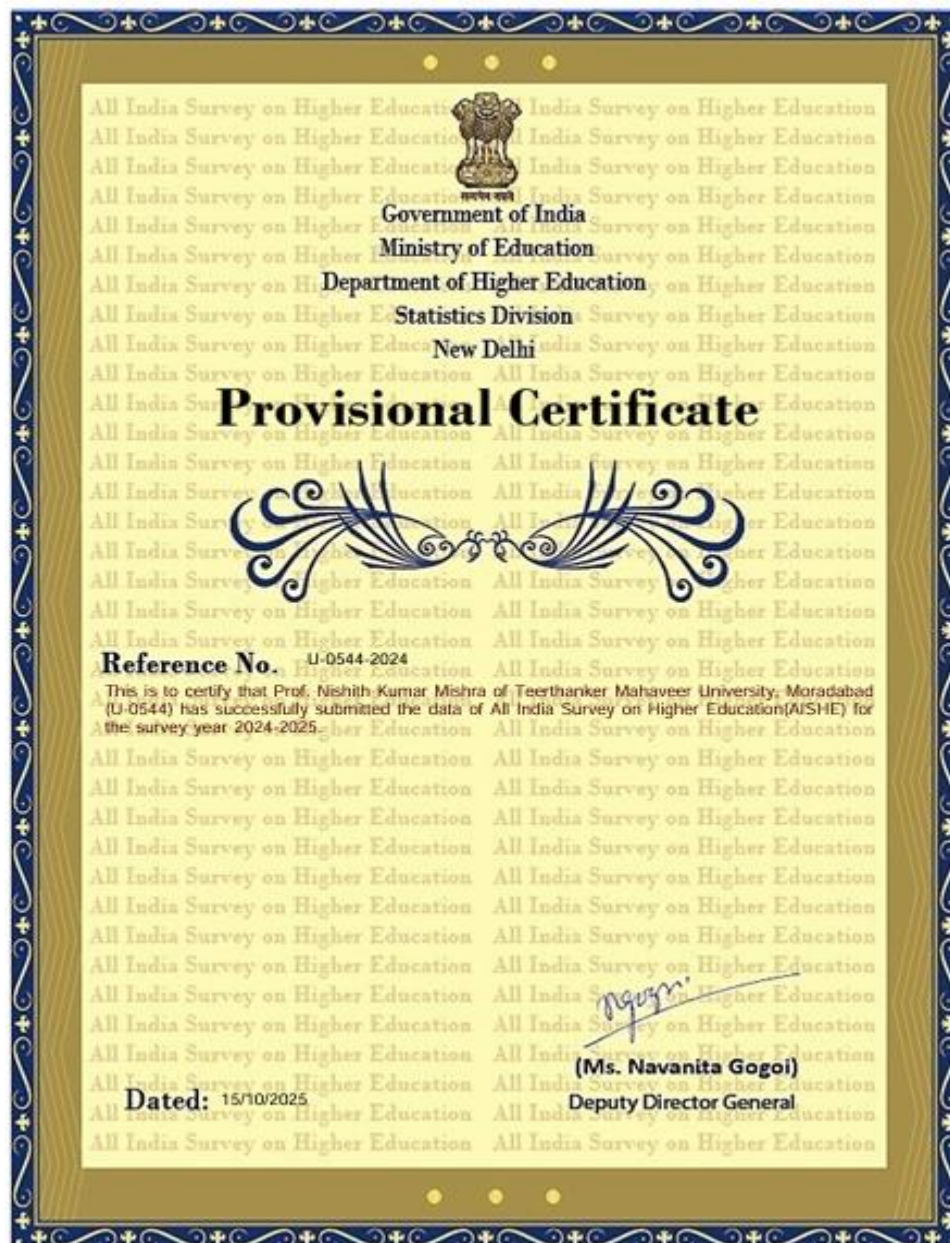
