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IQAC Welcomes all Members in 25th IQAC Meeting (September 12th, 2026)

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Report on the 25th IQAC Meeting, held on 12th September, 2026

The major focus of IQAC Meeting was on institutional quality enhancement, accreditation preparedness, ranking data submission, faculty sensitization and engagement for environmental aspects of sustainability, research strengthening, consultancy projects, Revenue generation through sponsored projects, ancillary departments' quality audits and conduction of EDP and MDP programs. The meeting emphasized the readiness for NAAC Cycle-3, NIRF Rankings 2027, THE Rankings, and QS Sustainability Rankings 2027 & 2028.

The Director-IQAC presented the participation status of NIRF Rankings 2026 and queries responded for registered disciplines. The Director-IQAC apprised members regarding preparation of NAAC Navision data for the academic years 2023-24, 2024-25, and 2025-26 in view of the upcoming NAAC Cycle-3.



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Major Decisions

1. All Colleges were encouraged to plan and organize training programmes on the environmental aspects of sustainability, with activities aligned to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (UN SDGs).
2. All Colleges were directed to generate revenue via Consultancy and Sponsored Research Projects, with emphasis on increasing the number and cumulative value of consultancy and sponsored projects.
3. All Colleges were instructed to update the designated NAAC Navision data as per SOP 39 by the 10th of every month.
4. The AAA audit is to be conducted through external members.
5. The Colleges were advised to strengthen key NIRF parameters such as student intake v/s enrolment, increase in no. of students in doctoral programmes, pass percentage, Faculty–Student Ratio (FSR), increase in Awards of Ph.D., median salary, etc.
6. All Colleges were directed to explore the opportunities of conducting and organizing Executive Development Programmes (EDPs) and Management Development Programmes (MDPs).
7. All College to have a designated IQAC Coordinator, and in case of any vacancy or discontinuation, a replacement for the vacancy/discontinuation is to be filled, and the name of the faculty member to be updated to IQAC.
8. It was discussed that Colleges shall maintain the progression to higher-studies and will update about the same to IQAC.
9. It has been suggested to get the NBA accreditation of the MCA program.
10. The Hon'ble Vice Chancellor instructed the alumni cell to plan and organize various activities involving alumni members and maintain documentation for the same.
11. External IQAC members expressed their willingness to contribute towards institutional sustainability initiatives, including rainwater harvesting, water conservation, and other sustainability-related initiatives/activities.



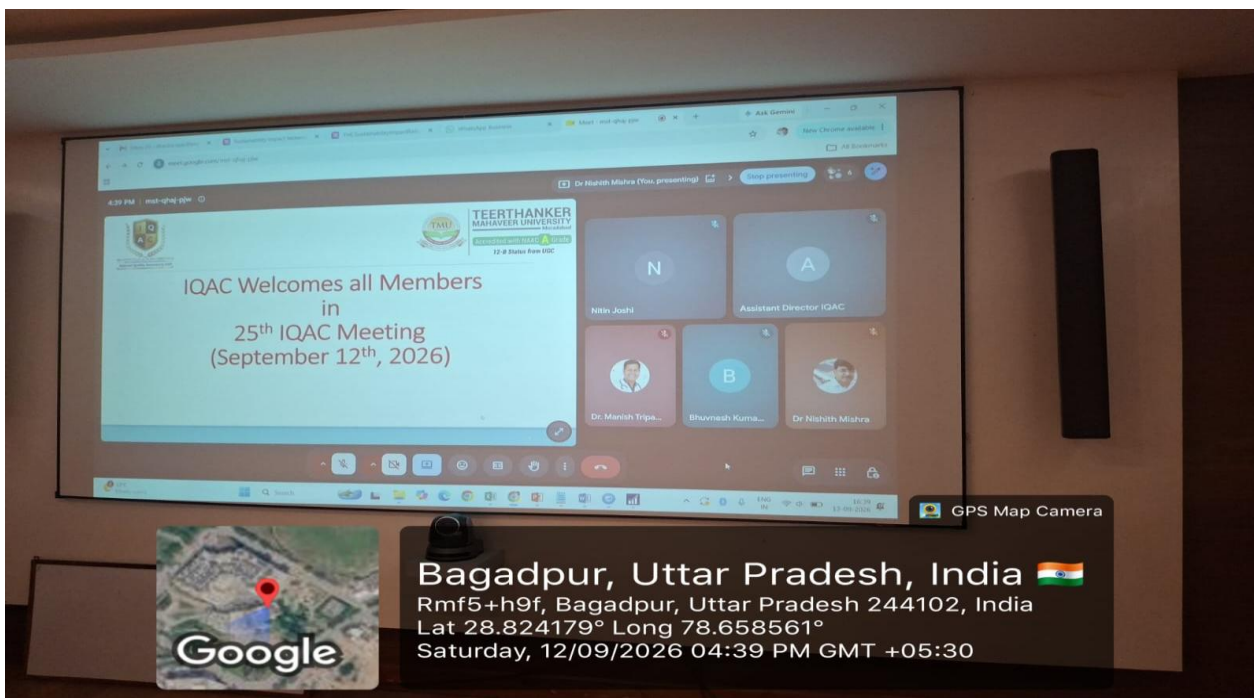
