POSH Act Awareness Session Held at Teerthanker Mahaveer University

January 12, 2026

Following the guidelines of the Ministry of Education and the UGC, Teerthanker Mahaveer University organized a comprehensive awareness session on the POSH Act, 2013. Nearly 200 students from the Dental College participated in the programme, along with faculty members and university officials. The event began with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp and a welcome address by Dean Students' Welfare Prof. M.P. Singh, who emphasized

the importance of maintaining a safe, respectful and inclusive environment in educational institutions and workplaces. Director Governance Dr. Neelima Jain outlined the objectives of the session and underlined the growing need for legal awareness regarding workplace dignity and safety. The keynote lecture was delivered by noted HR interventionist and corporate trainer Ajay Agrawal, who explained the background, significance and major

Round Table on AI in Healthcare Held at Teerthanker Mahaveer University



January 14, 2026

Teerthanker Mahaveer University hosted a round table discussion on "Artificial Intelligence in Healthcare," bringing together academicians, medical experts and stakeholders for an in-depth exchange of ideas. TMU Among India's Finest Universities, Says J.P. Nadda at Convocation 2026



March 14, 2026
Teerthanker Mahaveer University hosted its grand Convocation Ceremony 2026 on Saturday, where Union Health and Family Welfare Minister Jagat Prakash Nadda attended as the chief guest and described the institution as one of the finest universities in the country. Addressing the gathering, Mr. Nadda praised the university for setting a strong benchmark of academic excellence and said that TMU is playing a major role in nation-building

by nurturing academic brilliance, leadership qualities and a strong sense of social responsibility among students. He highlighted the university's academic diversity, noting that nearly 60 percent of its 130 ongoing courses are linked to the medical field, and appreciated its commitment to accessible education through scholarships worth ₹75 crore. During the convocation, degrees were conferred upon 6,041 students, while 311 meritorious students were honoured with medals, including 108 gold, 105 silver and 98 bronze medals. The ceremony covered students from the academic sessions

2023–24 and 2024–25, including 36 PhD scholars, 1,364 postgraduate students, 4,411 undergraduate students and 230 diploma recipients. On the occasion, the university conferred an honorary Doctor of Letters degree upon Mr. Nadda in recognition of his distinguished public service, visionary leadership and remarkable contribution to nation-building. Padma Shri awardee Malini Awasthi was also honoured for her exceptional contribution to Indian folk and semi-classical music. A major highlight of the ceremony was the virtual inauguration of three new projects — the Business Incubation Centre, Tinkers' Lab

and Bahubali Gymnasium — aimed at promoting innovation, entrepreneurship and practical learning for students. Sharing important statistics, he informed students that the survival probability in an accident is nearly 97 percent at a speed of 32 km per hour, whereas it drops to around 20 percent at 64 km per hour. Students were also advised to maintain at least a three-second distance from the

vehicle ahead and to follow safe overtaking practices, including the over-the-shoulder technique and precautions while driving at night. A question-answer session was also organised where students raised queries related to helmet use, overspeeding, traffic signals and emergency situations.
