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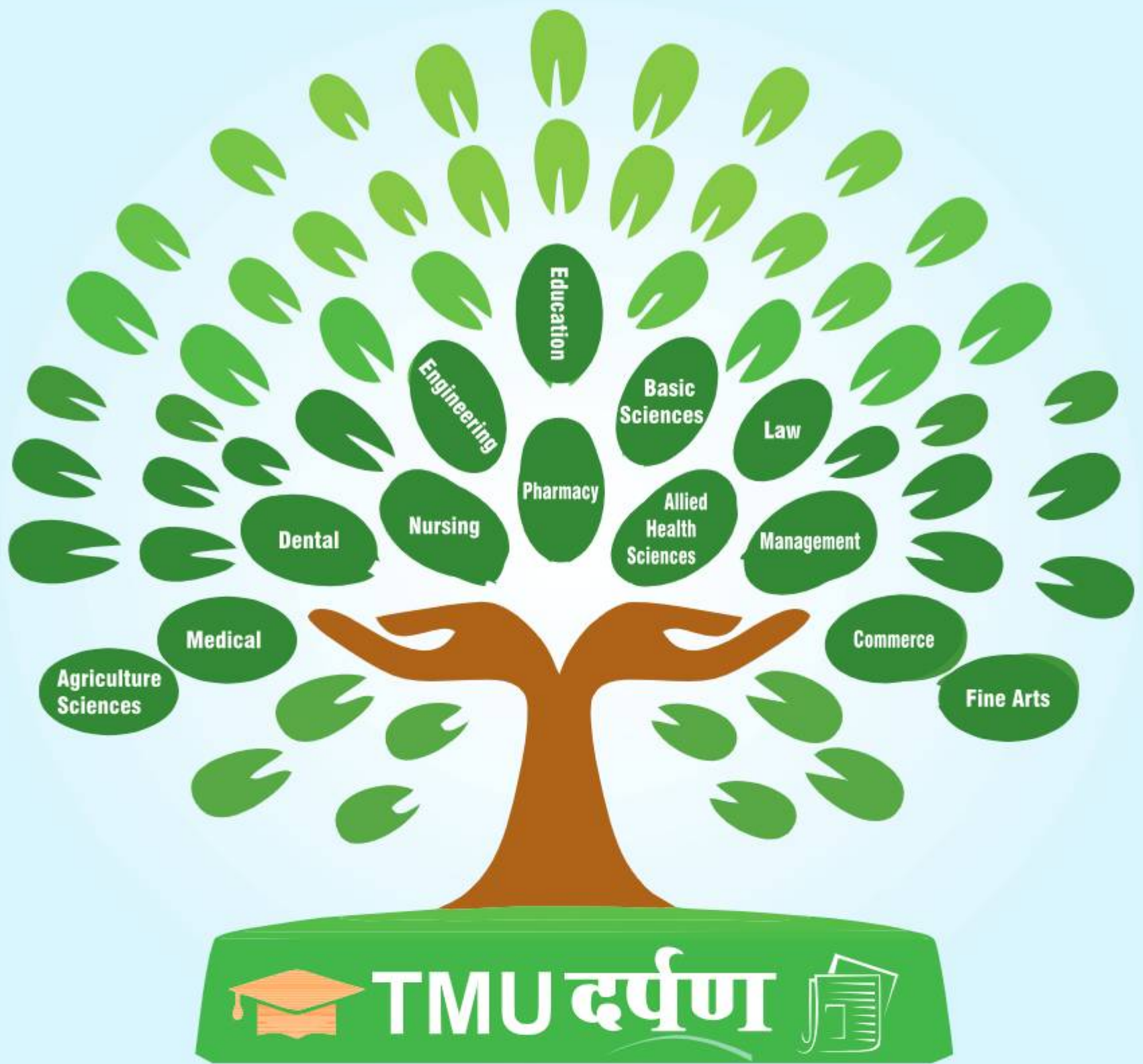

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Former Chief Justice Delivers Message of Leadership and Constitutional Values at TMU



April 2, 2026

Teerthanker Mahaveer University organized an inspiring talk series titled "From Courtroom to Nation Building: Leadership Lessons from the Judiciary," where former Chief Justice of India Justice Uday Umesh Lalit participated as the Chief Guest. The program began with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp before Goddess Saraswati, in the presence of Vice Chancellor Prof. V.K. Jain, Dean Academics Prof. Manjula Jain, Prof. Harvansh Dixit, and other dignitaries. Addressing the gathering, Justice Uday Umesh Lalit said that the judiciary is not merely a medium for delivering justice, but also a guardian of constitutional values and a strong force for social transformation. Encouraging the youth to uphold the Constitution and adopt ethical leadership, he called upon students to actively contribute towards nation-building with responsibility and integrity. During his address, Justice Lalit explained the significance of Articles 31A, 31B, 31C, and Article 21 of the Indian Constitution. He highlighted how these constitutional provisions strengthened land reforms, public welfare, and the right to live with dignity. He also

emphasized the crucial role of the judiciary in economic reforms, environmental protection, and ensuring social justice in society. Referring to the Supreme Court's decision declaring Triple Talaq unconstitutional, Justice Lalit described it as a landmark step towards the empowerment of Muslim women. He further stated that making free and compulsory primary education a fundamental right was a historic decision that strengthened the foundations of Indian democracy. At the conclusion of the event, TMU Chancellor Suresh Jain and Executive Director Akshat Jain felicitated Justice Uday Umesh Lalit with a memento as a mark of respect and appreciation. TMU Hospital Creates Medical Milestone with Successful Management of Rare **High-Risk Pregnancy**



May 14, 2026

In a remarkable achievement in maternal and neonatal healthcare, doctors at TMU Hospital successfully managed an extremely rare and high-risk pregnancy, leading to the safe birth of quadruplets through normal deliveries. The case has been described by medical experts as one of the most challenging and exceptional examples of obstetric care. The parents, Mohammad Alim and his wife Amina, residents of Obri village in Sambhal district, welcomed four newborns—two boys and two girls. What makes the case particularly extraordinary is that each baby developed in a separate amniotic sac, a rare medical condition that significantly increases risks for both the mother and the babies. According to doctors, the presence of four fetuses was detected during an ultrasound examination in the second month of pregnancy. Owing to the complexity and high-risk nature of the case, fetal reduction was initially suggested. However, the family chose to continue with the pregnancy and preserve all four babies. During the course of pregnancy, Amina experienced several complications, including liver-related issues and fluctuations in blood pressure, requiring repeated hospital admissions. The family remained committed to regular medical check-ups and treatment sessions every 15 to 20 days under the supervision of specialists at TMU Hospital. On May 8, Amina went into labour, and the first baby boy was delivered normally on May 9. The infant weighed approximately 710 grams at birth and is currently healthy and receiving breast milk. Considering that the pregnancy had reached only around six and a half to seven months, doctors successfully controlled the situation and delayed the

delivery of the remaining babies. Late last night, Amina again experienced labour pains and was immediately brought to TMU Hospital. This morning, three more babies were delivered—one boy and two girls. All newborns are currently under close medical observation. While one of the babies is reported to be completely stable, two others require specialized neonatal care. The entire treatment process was carried out under the continuous supervision and dedicated efforts of a team of doctors, including Dr. Shubhra Agrawal, Dr. Purti, Dr. Rolli and Dr. Monica, along with several nursing and support staff members. Medical experts stated that the case was exceptionally challenging, but timely intervention, continuous monitoring and the cooperation of the family contributed significantly to the successful outcome. Expressing gratitude to the hospital and its medical team, Mohammad Alim, who runs a grocery store, said he had complete faith in TMU Hospital from the very beginning. He added that his confidence in the institution had already been strengthened after his sister's successful delivery at the same hospital. Amina's sister, Imrana Parveen, also praised the quality of healthcare services provided by TMU Hospital, highlighting the timely treatment, effective medication and constant support extended by doctors and staff throughout the pregnancy. Hospital officials, including Director Ajay Garg, Chief Manager Vaibhav Jain and Anil Gupta, described the case as a shining example of teamwork, advanced medical management and unwavering commitment towards patient care. Medical experts emphasized that pregnancies involving quadruplets pose serious risks to both the mother and the babies. However, with timely treatment and constant monitoring, positive outcomes can be achieved. They further noted that the successful normal delivery of all four babies in such a complex high-risk pregnancy is considered a rare and significant accomplishment in the field of medicine.



Experts Advocate Multidisciplinary Engineering Approach for Sustainable Development at TMU International Conference

May 18, 2026

The Department of Electrical Engineering, College of Engineering, Teerthankar Mahaveer University (TMU), organized a two-day International Conference on "Innovations In Smart and Sustainable Engineering (ICISSE-2026)," bringing together experts, academicians and researchers from India and abroad to discuss emerging technologies and sustainable engineering practices. Around 62 research papers were presented during the conference, covering topics such as green energy, smart mobility, artificial intelligence, smart cities and sustainable technologies. Speaking at the inaugural session, chief guest Prof. Sachin Maheshwari, Vice-Chancellor of Guru Jambheshwar University, emphasized the need for a multidisciplinary approach in engineering to achieve sustainable development. Selected research papers presented at the conference will be published in the ISBN-registered conference proceedings.
