Agenda-4 Consideration and approval of the revision/amendments in the syllabi of different programmes of study.

The Principals of concerned colleges presented their proposals for the approval of the new or amendments in the existing syllabi of different programmes of study at their colleges in the order as given in the table below. The following discussions were made by the members while the proposals were presented by the Principals:

1. While Prof R.K. Dwivedi presented the proposal for the College of Computing Science & IT, Prof Raghuveer Singh, Pro Vice Chancellor enquired about the concept of introducing the core and non-core courses. The Principal-CCSIT deliberated about the concept that presently the audit facility is given for non-core courses while the core courses are not having the audit facility.

2. Prof Raghuveer Singh shared his observation on the coding system for the courses while the syllabi for different programmes were presented by the Prof Vipin Jain, Principal-TMIMT. During the discussion, Prof Raghuveer Singh proposed to decrease the classroom study hours in the final semester of the MBA programme so that more number of hours can be provided to the students for On-job training or project work, thus enhancing their employability. Prof Vipin Jain apprised that the work is being done in this direction and shall be presented before the Council during its next meeting provided if it is discussed and recommended in the next meeting of the Board of Studies. Vice Chancellor advised that due care must be taken while designing the curriculum on these lines so that students do not have disconnect from the academics. Prof Ajay Ruhela added to give more space in the curriculum for training on various avenues like competitive exams, esp. for engineering students. Prof K.K. Pande, Dean-Academics also had the consensus on it. It was also discussed to redesign the curriculum where-in there is weightage on the industrial training/grooming sessions or introducing some value added papers so as to enhance the employability of the students. The members had the consensus on these suggestions. Further, Mr Firasat A.Zaidi suggested considering for evolving the mechanism so as to motivate students for self study. It was suggested by the members to keep 02 Saturdays off and 02 Saturdays for the presentation on assignments in a month where-in the students will prepare for the assignments on the Saturdays which are off. It was decided for the Principals to assess these suggestions and give their views and feedback post two weeks after this meeting.

- **10.2** Prof Vipin Jain proposed the changes in the credits being aligned with the University Ordinance in the syllabi of MBA programme for the session 2016-17 and 2017-18. The Council considered and approved the action taken by the Vice Chancellor in the same context.
- 10.3 Mr Firasat A. Zaidi suggested to do the risk analysis in cases of the collaboration being done. Prof Pande, Dean-Academics mentioned about the 06 points pertaining to the MoUs being signed-off those were raised during the last meeting of the Council and the information is being sought from the concerned on the same. It was agreed upon that the colleges will present their views on the following points:
 - 1. Written objectives of the collaboration and its benefit in terms of TMU faculty getting trained for the future, getting better profile of the students.
 - 2. A cost benefit report on the past collaborations and how the University has benefited from the same.
 - 3. Effect on placement of the students in collaborative projects.
 - 4. How On-job Training (OJT) would be beneficial to the students and its impact on the University.
 - 5. Mechanism to evaluate the benefits of the collaboration on annual basis.
 - 6. Comments on loss of revenue due to revenue sharing verses the benefit on account of intake.
- 10.4 Prof R.K.Dwivedi, Principal-CCSIT, proposed to start four programmes in collaboration with i-Nurture from the academic session 2019-20. He apprised the members CCSIT faculty members and i-Nurture team are working on the curriculum design of these programmes and shall place in the next meeting of the Academic Council for its consideration. The following are the four programmes:
 - 1. B.Tech (CSE)-Artificial Intelligence
 - 2. BCA-Data Science
 - 3. BBA-Business Analytics
 - 4. BBA-Entrepreneurship Management

The council authorized the Vice Chancellor to take decision in the above context and shall get it placed in the next meeting of the Council for its approval.

10.5 The council approved the various short-term value added courses of varying duration that were optional, domain specific and offered outside the curriculum and add value to the employability skill of the students. The brochure, course content and sample certificates for the same were already approved by the Dean (Academics) and the Vice Chancellor. The members discussed and approved the same as per details given below:
