With this objective, it was proposed to establish various departments under the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences. The members discussed and considered the proposal as above.

Bansal as Observer to the Committee.

#### EC 21.21 Any other matter with the permission of Chair.

- A. The Council was requested to consider the amendments in the following clauses of the Seed Money Scheme 2021
  - i. In the clause 3.1 in relaxing the minimum qualification of PhD in case of the applicants from Medical, Dental, Nursing, Paramedical and Physiotherapy

- disciplines. However, the minimum work experience (clinical/teaching/research) of 05 years is mandatory in above cases. Prof Ajay Pant suggested to frame the eligibility criteria in such cases on the grounds similar to the eligibility criteria given for Research Supervisor in the PhD Ordinance-2021 of the University. The members had the consensus over his suggestions.
- ii. In the clause 4.1, the seed money project grant which was earlier in the range of Rs 50000 to Rs 200000 (Rupees Two Lakhs) has been revised with an upper limit upto Rs 1000000/-( Rupees Ten lakhs).
- iii. In the clause 8.10, the data base ICI is deleted.
- iv. In the clause 8.14, the release of sanctioned grant will be in accordance with the Project Gantt chart and requirements of the project.
- v. In the clause 8.15, purchase of equipment from seed money grant as mentioned in the Research proposal and approved by RPEC is permissible.
- vi. The maximum permissible duration of the project will be 02 years.

# RESOLVED THAT THE AMENDMENTS IN THE CLAUSES OF SEED MONEY SCHEME 2021 WITH THE SUGGESTIONS AS ABOVE ARE APPROVED.

B. The Council was requested to consider the proposal for creating the posts of Deputy Director/Vice Principals as the second line of leadership in the Colleges of University in accordance with the provisions of sub-section 12 of section 14 of U.P. Private Universities Act 2019 for sharing the work load of the college Principal/Director. Further, it was also proposed to keep the posts of Academic Directors/Deputy Directors/HoDs for 03 years on rotation basis. However, the same is extendable for another term(s).
